

## **BIBLIOGRAPHIES AND REFERENCING YOUR ASSIGNMENTS**

If you use books or internet articles for an assignment you should list them at the end of your work under the title Bibliography.

The School uses the **MLA** (Modern Languages Association) method of referencing.

Below is a simple guide to help you cite articles you have used in the work you research for homework, essays and other School assignments.

**Please note where to put the full stops, commas and colons.**

### **BOOKS**

Author's last name, First name or initials. Title. City: Publisher, Year.

#### **Example:**

Magorian, Michelle. Goodnight Mr. Tom. London: Puffin, 1981

### **REFERENCE BOOKS**

Title. City: Publisher, Year.

#### **Example:**

The Cambridge Encyclopedia of Human Evolution. Cambridge: Cambridge University Press, 1992

### **ARTICLES**

Author's last name, first name. Title of Article. *Title of Publication* Date Published: Pages

#### **Example:**

Miller, Arthur. 'A Memory of Two Mondays.' 24 Favorite One Act Plays. Ed. Bennett Cerf and Von H.Carmell. Broadway Books, New York,USA.2000.10-63.

### **INTERNET**

Author's last name, first name. Title of Online Article. Title of Online Publication Version (Year Published): Pages. Date Accessed <Web address>.

#### **Example:**

Marshall, Michael. 'Killing beached whales is kinder, experts say.' New Scientist (2009):11 pars. 25 Mar 2009< <http://www.newscientist.com/article/dn16830-killing-beached-whales-is-kinder-experts-say.html>>

### **CD ROM**

Title of Article. Title of Media. CD-ROM. City: Publisher, Year.

#### **Example:**

Encyclopedia Britannica 2006. CD-ROM. North Sydney: Encyclopedia Britannica Australia, 2006.
